Diane Parham, Ph.D., OTR/L, FAOTA, is professor and director of the Occupational Therapy Graduate Program at the University of New Mexico. She received her bachelor's and master's degrees in occupational therapy from the University of Florida and University of Southern California, respectively, and her doctoral degree in education from the University of California Los Angeles. Parham is known for her research and scholarship in the fields of sensory integration, play and occupational science. Among her publications are a textbook, *Play in Occupational Therapy for Children*, now in its second edition, and *Sensory Processing Measures*, two nationally standardized parent-teacher questionnaires for preschool and school-aged children. Parham is a founding member of the Sensory Integration Research Collaborative (SIRC), a national work group dedicated to multi-site research designed to systematically develop knowledge in sensory integration and its applications to intervention for children with disabilities.
